# First Call for Collaborative Projects 08-10-2012

#### Goal of the call

The current call aims at fostering interactions between basic scientists and clinicians working in the field of psychiatric research. It also aims at facilitating collaboration between different Bio-Psy partners' sites. In order to boost translational research approaches, projects based on new collaborations between clinicians and basic scientists are strongly encouraged. As support provided by Bio-Psy will be limited, it can be considered as seed money to prepare later application to other national or international sources of funding.

## **Eligibility**

Although there is no limitation in the number of partners, applications must involve at least <u>either</u> two participating partners of the Labex Bio-Psy, located on distinct campuses <u>or</u> one Bio-Psy participant and a member of the Fondamental Network of "Expert Centers". In all cases, the project coordinator must be a Bio-Psy participant.

All themes outlined in the Bio-Psy 5 work packages will be considered:

- 1. Brain development and synaptogenesis
- 2. Neurotransmission and signalling
- 3. Brain plasticity from neural circuits to behaviour
- 4. Genes and environment interactions
- 5. Mental health and society<sup>1</sup>

The funding (up to 50 000 Euros for 12 to 24 months) can be requested to cover running costs and small equipment purchases and/or salaries of personnel (e.g., post-docs or technicians). A Bio-Psy group may submit multiple applications, but will be funded for only one project within this call.

#### **Evaluation criteria**

- Project scientific interest and relevance to Bio-Psy main scientific axes
- Partners teams' complementarity and added value of the collaboration
- Project feasibility
- Justification of the approach chosen and of the budget

### **Timeline**

Projects will be evaluated by an *ad-hoc* committee (including experts outside of Bio-Psy and members of the Steering Committee not applying to the call) before the end of the year, funding will be made available from January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2013.

Approximately up to 5-7 projects will be funded.
